

# SD51 2026 RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

[Below is my summary of the 2026 Resolutions passed at Precinct Caucus with recommendations to be voted on by the body at our upcoming convention. Please review, edit as needed and return comments to me (for changes) before we distribute to the ExComm and Convention. ]

THE BLOOMINGTON AND Richfield Precinct Caucuses passed a total of 25 individual resolutions. Some were duplicates, others were similar to existing planks in the Republican Party of Minnesota Platform.

- Section 1. Promote Economic Prosperity
- Section 2. Restore and Defend Civil Rights
- Section 3. Protect Our Health Care
- Section 4. Educate Our Children
- Section 5. Strengthen Our Families and Communities
- Section 6. Protects Public Safety
- Section 7. Strengthen the Rule of Law
- Section 8. Enjoy and Protect Our Natural Resources
- Section 9. Make Government Smaller and Better
- Section 10. Defend America at Home and Abroad

## SIMILAR TO EXISTING PLATFORM (7 resolutions)

One resolution was to support school choice, which is similar to language in Section 4.1

One resolution was to outlaw sanctuary cities and state, which is similar to language in Section 7.3.

One resolution was to eliminate frivolous lawsuits, which is similar to language in Section 7.

One resolution was to oppose policies based upon the theory of global warming, which is similar to language in Section 8.

Three resolutions supported voter ID, same day registration, paper ballots and opposed ranked choice voting, which is similar to language in Section 9.3.

## ARE ACTION ITEMS FOR STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (2 resolutions)

One resolution wants to require all GOP candidates to support the winner of the Primary.

One resolution wants full transparency in all GOP party documents.

## ANTITHETICAL TO EXISTING PLATFORM (1 resolution)

One resolution wants to delete Platform language in Section 9 which opposes instant runoff voting (Ranked Choice Voting)

#### CHANGE EXISTING PLATFORM (15 resolutions)

Five resolutions want to amend Section 4.1 to establish Education Savings Accounts.

Three resolutions want to amend Section 1 to specifically audit all daycare centers, and to oppose and prosecute fraud.

Two resolutions want to amend Section 2.1 to support the Positive Alternatives Act which would give support to pregnant mothers.

One resolution would add language to Section 9.4 to reallocate funds to rural construction.

One resolution would add language to Section 9.4 to encourage faster road construction.

One resolution would add language to Section 9 to return to the previous state flag.

One resolution would add language to section 10.1 to specifically support the Wounded Warrior program.

One resolution would add language in Section 5 to protect minors engaging in social media.
